Lauricet Wood is one of the rare wooded zones in the Camargue. Woods which have survived are usually located along river banks where they can find the fresh water they need. These woods are important habitats for local wildlife.

The gypsy camp memorial

A memorial has been erected in memory of the gypsies who were interned in the Saliers camp between 1942 and 1944. They were interned after a law, voted on April 6, 1940, prohibited nomads from travelling anywhere within continental France during the war and placed them under house arrest.



The "Grand Sud des Cuisines" Conservatory

In 2001 local chefs and farmers founded the « Conservatoire Grand Sud des Cuisines » to promote our regional culinary heritage with simple recipes based on Mediterranean foods. The chefs signed a Charter encouraging them to use fresh local produce, in season, to promote the identity, taste and authenticity of local country products, and respect the tradition of Mediterranean nutrition.

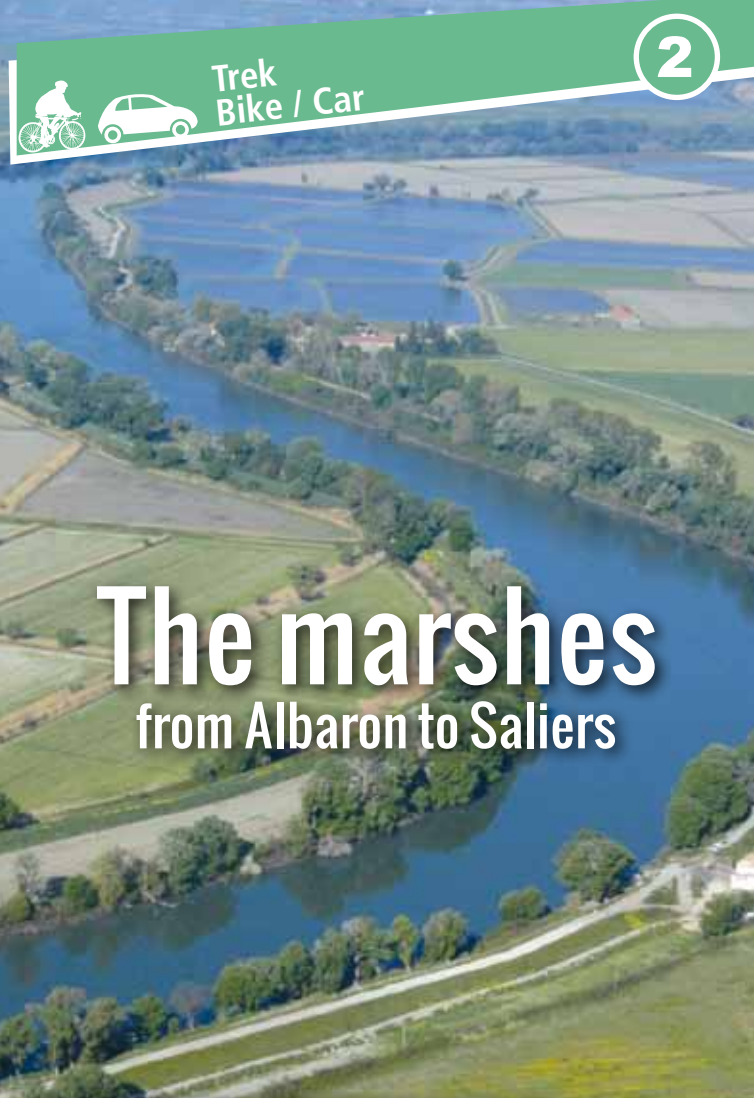

- Starting point :** Albaron primary school
- Distance :** a 20-km loop
- Take note :**
 - Bike portage on the Saint-Gilles foot bridges
 - Heavy automobile traffic on certain roads





2 The marshes from Albaron to Saliers

1 From the square in front of the **Albaron** elementary school take route D37 on your right toward Saliers. **2** After 1 km, turn left toward the **Mas de la Vigne**, a rice farm which can be visited on reservation only. **3** At the D572N crossroads (dangerous road), you have two options to continue on to **Saint-Gilles** **4** :

- By the **GR653** trail (trekking or mountain bike necessary) : continue on your right, then after 500m turn left onto the Route des Cabannettes. Cross the Petit Rhône, then go right on route D179. (⚠️ You will have to carry your bike across the 2 foot bridges.) Right after the bridges, leave the GR653 and turn left on a dirt road to the port. The village is on your right.

Or by **route D37** (any bike) : turn left, cross the bridge and continue along the road to the village (⚠️ dangerous road).

To reach **Saliers** **5**, take route D572N toward Arles, then turn right on D37 toward Saliers and Albaron. You can stop for a break in Saliers before heading back to Albaron via route D37.

How to get there

- **From Arles** : take route D570 toward Les Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer. When you reach the L'Agachon Hotel-Restaurant, turn right toward Albaron. Park on the side of the street.
- **From Les Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer** : take route D570 toward Arles. When you reach the L'Agachon Hotel-Restaurant, turn left toward Albaron. Park on the side of the street.
